Slowpitch Softball Leagues

RULES & REGULATIONS

Article I - GENERAL MANAGEMENT

Shall be under the Department of Parks and Recreation of the City of Bloomington (*BPARD*) which shall conduct and regulate all League rules and regulations.

Article II - PURPOSES

1. To promote a recreation program for the city and surrounding areas.
2. To create civil betterment, good citizenship, sportsmanship, and good fellowship.

Article III - LEAGUE NAME

Henceforth: Bloomington Parks & Recreation Men's, Women's, and Co-Rec Slowpitch Leagues:

1. **Men's Open Slowpitch**
 - A. Recreational B
 - B. Recreational A
2. **Women's Open Slowpitch**
 - A. Recreational
3. **Co-Rec Open Slowpitch**
 - A. Recreational B
 - B. Recreational A

Article IV - MEMBERSHIP

Teams and Players: Shall be open to all teams/players which believe in and carry out League objectives. They shall fully abide by and live up to rules and regulations of the League. Total number of teams allowed into the League and their class and/or division will be determined by BPARD administration.

Players:

1. Age requirement for men is 18 years of age or older.
2. Age requirement for women is 16 years of age or older.
3. Each player must personally sign roster form. **No manager may sign for a player.**
4. Protest of player eligibility must be submitted in writing within 24 hours of said game with any proof of claim.

New Players:

1. Rosters changes must be completed on the official Drop/Add form and turned into BPARD office during hours of operation.
2. May be added to the total team roster by the manager only.
3. Player is eligible to participate in League play 24 hours from the time the manager submits a roster addition form to BPARD office.
4. If total team roster drops below 12 players, three may be added, following the above-mentioned procedure.

Rosters:

1. Purpose of signing roster is to insure players participate legally on their respective team. Because of the large number of teams and vast turnover of players throughout the season, BPARD is unable to inform every manager of those changes. Therefore we ask each and every manager's assistance in following the roster regulation. Contact Athletic Program Manager if there are questions concerning eligibility.
2. Players may not play on more than one team per league but may play in other leagues as long as they remain in the same league classification. For example: All recreational A players may play in any of the recreational A leagues. **Exception:** Rec B league teams may have no more than two (2) Rec A level players on their roster. Rec A league teams may have no more than two (2) intermediate level players on their roster. NO Intermediate level players may compete on any Rec B Team.

3. No overall team rosters will be provided to team managers, other than their own.
4. If League members wish to review a team's roster, a meeting must be scheduled with the Athletic Program Manager at least one day in advance.
5. Rosters are frozen as of June 19 of current season unless total team roster drops below 12 players.
6. No team roster may exceed twenty (20) players.
7. A copy of team rosters will be available on site during post season tournament play. These will be utilized by umpires **only** when an eligibility protest is filed and a decision must be made on site in order to determine who plays the next game **that same night**. Otherwise, the protest procedures of Article IX, rule #10 must be followed.

Player Eligibility

1. **ALL** eligibility concerns must be initiated by the team manager.
2. When a manager initiates an eligibility concern to the umpires on site, it can either be through an objection or protest.
3. Objection - A manager can object to a player(s) taking the field for the opposing team when said player(s) has played previously that night for another team in the same league. Objections can only be presented to the umpire prior to the start of the game and cannot be changed to a protest later.
4. Objections presented by the manager and upheld by the umpire will result in the game being called a forfeit (if the team now has less than nine eligible players).
5. Protest - Player(s) believed not to be on the official team roster can be protested any time before the final out of the game. Eligibility protests must follow the same procedures that are stated in league rules.
6. A protested game must continue on with play and a decision will be handed down by the League Director in a timely manner.

Article V - REVIEW COMMITTEE

Shall consist of 19 members; one elected manager from each league, one elected A.S.A. umpire, the Director of Parks & Recreation, and Athletic Program Manager.

Meetings of the Committee may be called at at any time by the Chairman or by a majority of the members of the Committee.

1. **Members**
 - A. **Election:** Committee members shall be elected annually by a majority vote of League Managers present in quorum at the annual Team Managers' meeting. The Amateur Softball Association (A.S.A.) Umpire of this committee shall be elected annually by a majority vote of peers present in quorum at the annual Umpires meeting.
 - B. **Vacancies:** Vacancies may be filled by Chairman of the meeting called for that purpose. Such appointment must be approved by a majority vote of the Committee present in quorum at meeting.
 - C. **Removal:** Any elected member may be removed at anytime by a two-thirds majority vote by the Committee. Any such removal shall be deemed as a vacancy.
 - D. **Chairman:** Chairman of the Committee shall be the Athletic Program Manager, who shall vote only in case of a tie. Chairman shall have general supervision of the business and affairs of any and all League and Committee matters.

E. **Conduct at Meetings:** Anyone may attend a Review Committee hearing. Orderly conduct shall be displayed at all times during such meetings. Anyone wishing to speak shall stand and remain silent until recognized by the Chairman.

2. **Function of Review Committee:**

Review Committee will interpret and rule on by vote team protests based on the BPARD Rules and Regulations and the A.S.A. Official Guide. All team protest will be screened by the Athletic Program Manager to determine whether the protest merits Committee action.

A. Following are examples of protests handled directly and solely by the Athletic Program Manager:

- 1) Protest on a judgment call
- 2) Minimum two-game suspension of player/coach (*Rule #2, Article IX*).
- 3) Player eligibility
- 4) Interpretation which is clearly understandable and in writing

B. Following are examples which may merit Committee action:

- 1) Protest of Athletic Program Manager rulings
- 2) Interpretation which is not clearly understandable and in writing

C. Other Duties

- 1) Advisory capacity to Athletic Program Manager in the following matters:
 - a. Rules and regulations
 - b. Schedules
 - c. Division structures
 - d. Player conduct
- 2) Any duty delegated by the Chairman of the Committee

Article VI - FEES

1. BPARD will determine amount and deadline of all entry fees assessed each team in League and for all tournaments.
 - A. All leagues - \$375.00
2. Entry fees will be used to defray expense of Leagues/Tournaments.
3. A \$20 fee will be collected each time a team forfeits a league game. Fee must be paid at BPARD office between 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, before the next scheduled game or that game will also be forfeited. If team forfeits last game of the season, fee must be paid within five days or that team will not be allowed to play the following year.

Article VII - AWARDS

Each League champion shall receive a first-place award plus individual player shirts. Second-and third-place teams will receive a team award. Each post season tournament champion shall receive a first-place award.

If a team has won a league title for two (2) consecutive seasons, that team must attempt to play in a higher level of play, change leagues, or forfeit the rights to league and tournament awards. Exception: If team has less than 50% returning roster & maintains that roster for a minimum of six (6) league games.

Article VIII - AMATEUR SOFTBALL ASSOCIATION REGULATIONS

1. A team/player participating in the BPARD softball league becomes a registered A.S.A team/player when said team submits a team roster and each and every member of said team has personally signed own name, address, on the **A.S.A. official team roster form**.
2. All A.S.A. registered teams' and players' registration is terminated on December 31 of current season.
3. Any team and/or player wishing to compete in A.S.A. state tournament play may request reclassification, but must do so prior to June 1 of current season. All reclassification's must be submitted to Athletic Program Manager in writing. Include name, address, present classification (*slowpitch B, C, or D*), briefly state reason for requesting reclassification. See the Illinois A.S.A. Handbook for details.

Article IX - RULES AND REGULATIONS (All Leagues)

Note: All BPARD League and Tournament games shall be governed by the A.S.A. Official Guide (*current year*) and BPARD Rules and Regulations (*current year*). **BPARD Rules and Regulations shall prevail in all cases.**

1. Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated. Team managers are mandatory and held responsible for their players' and spectators' conduct on/off the field of play. Any League member/spectator guilty of flagrant unsportsmanlike conduct on City facilities will be reviewed for suspension from League.
2. Any player/coach ejected from a game by an umpire shall be suspended from League participation for a minimum of two full games. Individual may also be ejected from park premise and must leave within one minute, if he continues to act in an unsportsmanlike manner, his team shall automatically forfeit the game if manager and/or captain does not enforce the umpire's ruling. If individual continues to conduct himself in an unsportsmanlike manner, he will be suspended from the League.
3. No individual player may dispute an umpire's call except for the designated manager if he/she does so in a sportsmanlike manner. Violation of Rule #3 shall result in suspension by the Department. **No protest and/or disputing of judgment calls.**
4. Any team which forfeits a game must pay a \$20 fee, which must be paid at BPARD office (*during regular office hours*) before the team's next game. A team which forfeits three scheduled playing dates during the season will be dropped from the League. A team that forfeits two consecutive scheduled playing dates will be dropped from the League.
5. **Time Rule:** In a league game, no inning starts after one hour of play. Umpire's watch or designated one shall be official. A game called due to time limit will be considered "official" no matter how many innings have been played. It is the team's responsibility to check with the umpire when game starts as to the official time. If the game is tied after 7 innings with time remaining, game will be played to 1-hour limit.
6. A 10-minute grace period for **6:00 p.m. games only** each evening on all fields will be provided. Forfeit will be declared if nine players are not on the field and starting line up has not been submitted to the plate umpire. The 10-minute grace period is only allowed if a team has less than nine players by game time. For all other game times, game time is forfeit time.
7. Visiting team shall use any space available on the first-base side of the playing field for the pre-game warmup. Home team shall use the third-base side unless there is a mutual understanding by both managers to the contrary. Under no circumstances will the infield be used for practice before game time. All teams are expected to cooperate with umpires and ground supervisor in this gesture.
8. Teams must submit to official scorekeeper (*home team*) and umpires, a list of team batting order prior to game. Home team is also required to submit their team batting order if requested by visiting team.
9. **Run Rule:** This rule shall prevail in all league games. A team ahead by twenty runs anytime after three, fifteen after four, ten after five full innings shall be declared the winner. **Note:** Home team will not bat in their half of the inning beginning with the fifth inning if they are leading by the ten-run rule.
10. **Protests:** All protests must be submitted in writing within 24 hours to the BPARD office. Each protest must be accompanied by a \$10 fee. If the protest is honored, fee will be returned. If the protest is disallowed, fee will be deposited into League account. For a protest to be valid, manager must notify plate umpire and **both** managers must sign the scorecard before the next pitch. It is a responsibility of the protesting manager to make sure this is done before the next pitch. If a team protests a game because of a player's eligibility, the player in question must immediately show a picture ID to the home plate umpire who will document the information on the scorecard. If the player in question refuses or has no ID, they are ineligible to play that game. Once the protest has been officially filed, the game will continue and a decision will be made by the Athletic Program Manager.
11. Tournament and League games will be operated under a two-man umpire system. All officials will be certified with the A.S.A. and dress according to A.S.A. regulations. Teams cannot protest a game because a two-man system did not operate the game in question.
12. No player will be allowed to play if there is evidence that player has been drinking prior to coming to the game.

13. No player playing professional or semi-professional baseball or softball is eligible to participate in the League.
14. Final standing of each division will be determined by win/loss records. Tie games shall be recorded as such and count as 1/2 win and 1/2 loss. If there is a tie for league championship, tie will be broken by: a) past direct competition between teams, b) number of runs scored between direct competition, c) number of runs scored allowed in season, d) playoff.
15. A change in managers and/or change of mailing address or email of manager must be reported to the Parks and Recreation office. BPARD is not responsible for misdirected mail because of above aforementioned rule.
16. All leagues: Batter begins with a one ball and one strike count. Second foul ball after two strikes is an out.
17. Suspended Games: Games suspended by rain or lightning before 4 complete innings shall be replayed from the beginning at a later date. Games suspended by rain or lightning after 4 complete innings shall be a completed game.
18. Forfeited Games: If a team calls into the Bloomington Parks and Recreation Department office to forfeit a game and the game is cancelled, said game will remain a forfeited game.
19. **Home Run Limits** per team out of the ballpark. Any homeruns hit over the limit will be ruled outs.
 - Men's Rec "B" = 2
 - Men's Rec "A" = 4
 - Co Rec "B" = 2
 - Co Rec "A" = 4 (*3 at O'Neil*)
20. Double First Base: A batted ball hit over the white portion of the base is fair, over the colored portion is foul. If an infielder is making a throw to first, the batter-runner must use the colored base while the defense use the white base. The infielder must appeal verbally or by tagging the runner before they return to first base if the batter-runner misses first base or uses any part of the white base.
 - A. if the ball is hit to the outfield or the infielder is not making a play,
 - B. if the throw is coming from the foul side of the base to avoid a collision.

In any case, after the runner has passed the base, they must return to the white portion of the base.
21. No Stealing allowed.
22. **Home plate force-out rule is used.** Plays at home plate shall be force outs at all times. Catchers may simply step on home plate to put runner attempting to score out, or may still use normal tagging method. There will be a perpendicular chalk line 20 feet up the third base line, which will determine whether or not the runner advancing toward home plate may retreat back to third base. If runner crosses line and attempts to go back to third he/she should be ruled out immediately.

Article X - Rules and Regulations (Co-Rec League)

1. Teams must have 9 players to start and finish game. If a team plays with nine, the tenth batter shall be an automatic out in the batting order. When playing with nine, first batter must be gender with 5-players.
2. The batting order for Co-Rec softball shall alternate the sexes.
3. **No metal spikes** are allowed in Co-Rec leagues.
4. Co-Rec defensive positioning shall include 2 males and 2 females in the outfield, 2 males and 2 females in the infield, and 1 male and 1 female in the pitcher-catcher positions.

5. If the EP is used in Co-Rec, all 12 must bat, and any 10-5 male and 5 female may play defense. If the EP is used in Co-Rec, 12 players must be used. It is not permissible to use 11 players because of the alternative batters. Defensive positions may be changed as long as the following ratio is used: 2 male/2 female in the outfield, 2 male/2 female in the infield and 1 male/1 female as pitcher/catcher. The batting order must remain the same throughout the game.
6. Any walk to a male batter (*intentional or not*), will result in a two base award. The next batter (*a female*) will bat. **Exception:** with two outs, the female batter has the option to walk or bat.
7. In all Co-Rec games, the 12” Softball will be used.

Article XI - Rule and Regulations (*Men & Women’s Open Leagues*)

1. Team must have nine players who are on the roster to start, continue, and finish a scheduled game for all leagues and tournaments. If a team plays with nine, the tenth batter shall be an automatic out in the batting order. Both teams should keep track of the automatic out. This is not the umpire's responsibility. **Notice:** When a team is using the EH (*Extra Hitter*)—if a player leaves the game for any reason other than an ejection, and the team has no substitutes, a team can finish with ten, eleventh man would be out. However, if a player is ejected—the game would be forfeited.
2. Women’s League will use an 11” softball for game play. Men’s leagues will use a 12” softball for game play.

Article XII - Rain Procedures

1. BPARD will make a decision as to whether or not to cancel scheduled games due to inclement weather after 4:00 pm. Players/managers may call the **HOTLINE** at **434-2FUN (2386)** to check on the status of their games. **DO NOT CALL THE BPARD OFFICE PHONE NUMBER!**
2. If the decision after 4:00 pm is game cancellation, BPARD will notify **WJBC, Radio 1230 AM**. Please inform your players to contact their manager, or the hotline, **NOT THE DEPARTMENT OFFICE**.
3. If the decision is **not** cancellation of games, it is solely the umpire's and/or Athletic Program Manager decision whether or not a scheduled game will be played. Teams must report to the playing field or risk forfeit should it be possible to play the games.
4. Under no circumstances will a league or tournament game be rescheduled if teams fail to follow rain procedures.
5. Rain games will be rescheduled at the end of the season, added in as 6:00 pm games, or Sundays, when necessary. Make up games will be posted on site, sent to managers via email, and posted on the sports webpage at **www.cityblm.org/sports**
